I feel honoured and quite happy to present the Annual Report of Cordova Senior Secondary School for the Academic Year 2018-'19.

Cordova Schools, run by the Kerala Educational and Charitable Trust(KECT) established in 1993 by a group of God fearing, service minded gentlemen from all over Kerala mainly NRIs. Established in 1995, Cordova Senior Secondary School draws its inspiration from the philosophy of our great educators. It aims at the overall development of the weaker section of the society and to uplift the poor mass and bring them to the mainstream. As is known to every enlightened person, a balanced education is one that takes care of the overall development of the learners thereby equipping them to succeed in life. Ours is a co-educational senior secondary school affiliated to C.B.S.E. The school functions under a three-tier system i.e., Principal, Coordinators and Teachers. Classes I to V are supervised under Primary coordinator, VI to VIII under Middle coordinator, IX and X under Secondary coordinator and XI, XII under Senior Secondary Section coordinator. Different heads of the departments and various committees like Discipline committee, exam committee, assembly committee, programme committee, magazine committee, excursion committee smoothen the entire school functioning.

Academics

We could produce 100% results in classes X and XII Board examination held in March 2018. Amina Ashraf who was the school topper secured 94% and Rahees. S secured 93%. 7 students got the result between 80 and 90%. 16 students secured between 60% and 80%.

In class XII, we achieved 100% result. Ananthu Mahesh was the school topper.

We hope to secure better results in the coming examinations.

This academic year started on 4th June, 2018 after summer vacation for classes I to XII. LKG classes began on June 6th and UKG classes reopened on June 7th. Std. XI classes began on June 11th.

The new academic year was welcomed with colourful assembly activities. We have specially designed the morning assembly in a way that would bring out the best in each and every student, thereby enhancing his/her confidence and morale. The morning assemblies also help the students inculcate the following values and regimes:-

1. Connecting with one's true self through program
2. Discipline and physical exercise
3. Ensuring cleanliness/personal hygiene
4. Orator skills
5. Patriotism

In the academic year 2018-'19, the assemblies have been classified into class wise, house wise and club wise. Various themes like Empathy, patriotism, honesty, discipline, truthfulness, afforestation, self-reliance, economy, courtesy, child abuse, being cyber safe, women empowerment are presented in the form of skit, dance drama, extempore, rendition, tableau, speech, mime, storytelling etc. Every week, assemblies are conducted alternatively in three languages Monday-English, Wednesday-Malayalam, Friday - Hindi. We make our assembly fun and exciting by incorporating leadership opportunities for students, showcasing their talents and incorporating motivational themes.

PROGRAMMES

The investiture ceremony for the academic year 2018-19 was held on July 10th. Head Boy: Vishnu R.S Head Girl: Farhana Asst. Head Boy: Muhammed Asif XIA Asst. Head Girl: Amina Asharaf, XIA; Junior Head Boy - Ahmed Yaseen- VA2, Junior Head Girl - Asia Ayoob-VA1, Sports Captains- Mohammed. S, XA1 and Aafiya.A XIA1 took charge as leaders. The Club activation and inauguration of musical instrument classes was held on 5th July, 2018 in the special assembly. Experts from Kerala State Jawahar Balabhavan played the music in the assembly. Leaders were conferred with the badges and sashes by the Chief guest Mr. Johny. P, Additional Sub Inspector of Police, Poonthura .

Sports Meet was held on 3rd and 4th August, 2018 with great zeal and excitement.

One of the major highlighting campaigns was the '***Swachhata Pakwada***'. In accordance with cleanliness drive to create awareness and implementation across the country, we observed "Swachhta Pakhwada" from 1st Sept to 15th Sep, 2018 as per the instruction given by CBSE. The students and staff solemnly pledged to do their best to clean and to keep their surroundings free from filth and unhygienic conditions and they also pledged to motivate others to do the same. Students

cleaned their classrooms and school premises. Members of P.T.A and Management, students, teachers and non-teaching staff contributed around 25 saplings. Many saplings were planted in and around the school premise for green and clean environment.

To give awareness about water conservation and purification, the members of the Health Club demonstrated water purification and chlorination in the Assembly. Videos related to water born diseases, proper method of hand washing, Importance of health and nutritious food were shown to the students. The demonstration of rain water harvesting was shown. In order to include community participation, pamphlets emphasizing the importance of cleanliness were distributed to the nearby residences.

Different competitions like essay writing about Clean India Drive, versification on the topic one step towards Clean India, quiz competition based on Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, emphasis on the principle of 3R's-Reduce, Reuse and Recycle in the form of skit, tableau were held. An exhibition of the recycled products was also organised. To propagate the idea of Swachhta, letter writing competition was held on 14.09.2018 for the students of Class X to XII. They were asked to write a letter to their parents about the importance of cleanliness and hygiene in their surroundings and to request to contribute for a better India. The certificates were given to the winners. Throughout SWACHHTA PAKHWADA programme, staff and students whole heartedly took part in every activity.

Another major celebration was the "***Paryatan Parv***". The Ministry of Tourism, Government of India organize a "Paryatan Parv" across the country to propagate the message of 'Dekho Apna Desh', with the objective to encourage Indians to visit various tourist destinations of the country. As per the instruction given by the CBSE, our school also integrated different programmes.

Essay competition 'Incredible India' was conducted for the students of classes 7 to 12 on 25th Sep. In the morning assembly, a picture quiz about famous tourist destinations of India was conducted on 26th Sep.

Students participated in the drawing competitions on the topic –' Different monuments of India' on 26th Sep.

Principal conducted a seminar on the topic 'Tourism and Tourist Destinations of India' on 27th Sep in the Multipurpose Hall.

Youth Festival

Various competitions were organized during the two days Youth festival on 28th and 29th Sep, in two different venues- Several art competitions were conducted in different categories I, II, III and IV. In stage-I light music, nadan patu, mappila pattu, group song, patriotic song, fancy dress, group dance, folk dance, national anthem, mono act, oppana, group dance, mimicry, mime etc. were conducted. Whereas in stage II recitation, elocution, extempore and storytelling in different languages were conducted.

As a part of **150th Birth Anniversary celebration of Mahatma Gandhi** a special assembly programme was conducted. A reminiscence was displayed in the assembly. 150 students lined up to welcome 'Gandhiji' and 'Kasthurba'. 'Gandhiji' spinning the thread in the spinning wheel, 'Charka' was also shown.

Observing the great tradition and imbibing the true spirit of Keralites , we celebrated '**Kerala Piravi**' on Nov.1, marking the birth of Kerala. The entire school witnessed a variety of programmes depicting the love for Kerala and Malayalam. The programme organised by the Department of Malayalam paved the way to remember and honour our mother tongue and mother land. The special guests invited were Mr. Adheef Muhamed, singer and our former student and Ms. Revathy Sampath, actress, also our former student.

School exhibition 'Resonance' was organised on 3rd Nov from 9.00a.m to 3.00 p.m. The Chairman inaugurated the exhibition in the presence of Manager, Principal, Members of the staff and PTA Executive members. 13 rooms were allotted for different sections like Kids World (KG section), English, Hindi, Malayalam, Arabic, Science, Social Science, Mathematics, Computer Science , Physical Education, Music, Art, Primary Corner. Parents were invited to be the part of the exhibition. The best exhibits bagged prizes.

Children's Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm on 14th November. Various colourful programmes like fancy dress, dance, songs etc. were organized. Ms. Shirin M Basheer the former student of the school and the first rank holder in M.A was the chief guest.

Festivals like Eid, Onam , Christmas were also celebrated with vibrant programmes.

World Environment Day, International Yoga Day, Pi Day, Anti Narcotic Day, Reading week , International Arabic day were celebrated with great pomp.

Hiroshima Day, Independence Day, were also commemorated. As part of Independence Day celebration, Inter house quiz competition, on the topic 'Freedom Struggle of India' was conducted by the Principal and Green House won the competition.

The school observed APJ Abdul Kalam's birth anniversary with the display of his books in the library, speech, audio clip about Abdul Kalam, video show etc. on 27th July.

Public Awareness campaign on Waste management & Environment Protection was organised in our school by the Department of Biotechnology, Mar Ivanios College in association with Kerala State Pollution Control Board. Dr. Sinju N.S, Asst. Professor, Dept of community medicine, Medical College took an awareness class on 'Water Pollution and human health', an interactive session by Dr. Sheela A.M, the senior environmental engineer, PCB and a

practical session about effective segregation of house hold waste and plastic to make our environment more eco-friendly was demonstrated.

Class Magazine & School Magazine

Each class from Std. V onwards prepare class magazine and the best articles will be selected for the school magazine which is expected to be released by the end of March 2019.

Examinations

School examinations are conducted in the form of periodic tests, half yearly examinations, yearly examination. Periodic test-1 was conducted in the month of July and Periodic test-2 in the month of August. Half yearly examination was conducted from 15th October to 26th October, 2018. Periodic tests for classes I to VIII was conducted from 10th December to 15th December.

External examinations

Our school was one of the exam centres for the UGC NET JULY 2018 examination. A couple of PSC exams were also conducted this year on 5th August., 13th October 2018.

Awards

Recognition of student's efforts is more highly valued than money. Honours are bestowed as recognition of outstanding academic achievement and as a means of encouragement. The best Academic Performance Award and the Best Achiever Award are meant for this.

The Good Attitude award recognizes outstanding individuals who have worked hard to live a life of good character and serve as role models for others.

The Best Talent Award honours leaders in arts, sports and other activities.

The Perfect Attendance Award is being given to honour students who have neither missed any days nor been late to class.

Services

To join hands with Chief Minister's distress relief campaign, our school received massive response from the parents and staff members. Around 320 kg of rice, 350 bottles of mineral water, 30 kg of sugar, 20 packets of flour items, 32 packets of oil, 55 packets of washing powder, 3 cartons of sanitary napkins, 32 bottles of hair oil, 3 cartons of biscuits, 40 bottles of Dettol, salt , sugar, other food items, stationery items like notebooks, pencils, pens, first aid items, cloth items. Etc were donated to the relief collection centre, Sanskrit College on 29th August . Besides this the staff contributed Rs. 10, 700 and students donated Rs. 11,510. A Demand Draft of Rupees Twenty Five Thousand was handed over to the Regional Office, Pattom for onward forwarding to Chief Minister's Distress Relief Fund.

Rs. 9300 contributed to Kerala State Council for Child Welfare.

PTA meetings for various classes were conducted in different days. The main purpose of the meeting was to create a common platform where teachers and parents come together to enrich the student's educational experiences and discuss variety of issues, regarding all-round development of students. Library

Our library has a good collection of wide variety of books. We could add a few more books to our existing collection, 543 books were purchased and 160 books were received as student/staff contribution. We do motivate students as well as staff to make use of library and inculcate the habit of reading. Book review and stories in different languages are being presented in the assembly.

Labs

We have full-fledged labs for Biology, Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science. We provide ample practical classes so that our children will be performing very well in the forthcoming Board examinations.

Infrastructure improvement

Our school witnessed a new launch- the inauguration of new play school on 3rd October, 2018. The play school was inaugurated by the Chairman in the presence of other dignitaries.

We are extremely grateful to the management for providing us six new computers, Wi-Fi Connector, musical instruments like tabla, keyboard, guitar, etc and good sound system, a new brand Photostat machine.

Construction of a new K.G. Block, a three storeyed building has just begun.
